Council Fire (Duty to God)

Wolf Council Fire Requirements:

Complete requirements 1 and 2 plus at least one other.

1. With your den or pack, participate in a flag ceremony, and learn how to properly care for and fold the flag.
2. Participate in a community service project with your pack, den, or family.
3. With your parent's or guardian's permission, talk to a military veteran, law enforcement officer, member of the fire department, or someone else approved by your den leader. Talk about his or her service to the community or country. After you have visited with the individual, write a short thank-you note.
4. Learn about the changes in your community, and create a project to show your den how the community has changed.
5. Select one issue in your community, and present to your den your ideas for a solution to the problem.
6. Work with your den to develop a den duty chart, and perform these tasks for one month.
7. Participate in an event such as a parade or assembly celebrating military veterans.

November, Week 1

◆ Activity: Flag Ceremony (Requirement 1)

- With your den or pack, participate in a flag ceremony, and learn how to properly care for and fold the flag. Covid Adaptation: Scouts participate in Simple Pledge of Allegiance flag ceremony to open video conference Den Meeting. Other resource-Flag ceremony video-

- Den Leader or Adult Partner and Scout demonstrate folding and caring for American Flag. Scouts at home fold flag with their family. If there is no flag a tablecloth or bedsheet may be substituted

November Week 2

◆ Activity: Talk! (Requirement 3)

- With your parent's or guardian's permission, talk to a military veteran, law enforcement officer, member of the fire department, or someone else approved by your den leader. Talk about his or her service to the community or country. After you have visited with the individual, write a short thank-you note.

Covid Adaptation: Guest speaker attends through videoconference. Allowing Scouts to ask questions. Afterwards Scouts write Thank you note that Den Leader forward to guest Speaker

November Week 3

◆ Activity: Community Service (Requirement 2)

- Participate in a community service project with your pack, den, or family.

Covid Adaptation: Prepare Food Drive Flyers For families to print and distribute to neighbors. Scout in uniform with family distributes flyers and picks of food on designated date to take to local Food Bank. Photos of the food drive and results are shared with members of the den
